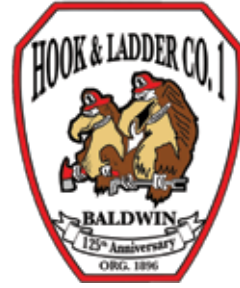
Timothy Hughes joined the Baldwin Fire Department in 1995 through Hook & Ladder Company One.

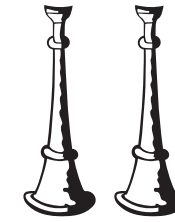

COMPANY HISTORY

Though the Baldwin Fire Department was approved by a vote in February, Hose Company No. 1 was officially organized on March 5, 1896. Since that date, over 400 Baldwinites have appeared on the Company's membership rolls.

Hose Company No. 1 has always played an active part in the activities of the Baldwin Fire Department. In 1915, it purchased the first motorized hose cart in the Department.

In 1921, the Company became the proud owner of one of the fastest REO "Speedwagon" Hose Trucks in this part of the state. In 1951, the Baldwin Fire District purchased the 1000-gallon Ahrens-Fox Pumper that is still in the possession of the Hose Company, and which has done valiant service not only in fighting fires in Baldwin, but also in Long Beach, Oceanside, and Freeport.

During the long and glorious history of the department, in state and country firematic parades and tournaments, Hose Company No. 1 has played a noble part, evidenced by the number of trophies and cups decorating the cabinets of its meeting room.

With the advent of the REO truck, the Company toured up and down Long Island winning prizes from Riverhead to Long Beach, and in 1922 was the State Champion in both motor hose and chemical contests for standard fire apparatus, winning those titles at the State Jamboree in Freeport.

The membership has been present for all major regional emergencies, including the Suffolk County wildfires in 1995, the tragedy of September 11th in 2001, Hurricane Sandy in 2012 and most recently, the continuing COVID-19 pandemic.

Several pieces of apparatus, once operated by Hose One have continued to serve Baldwin through the creation of Hose Two, Hose Three and Hose Four later in the Baldwin

Fire Department timeline. The original 1896 Hose Wagon was transferred to start Hose Company Two in 1913, our 1915 "Thomas Floranto" was transferred to Hose Three upon their inception 1922, and our 1929 Ahrens-Fox was transferred to Hose Company Four when they organized in 1951. Still a champion for our history, the membership of Hose One takes great pride in keeping our 1951 Ahrens-Fox pumper in top shape, participating in parades and social events throughout Baldwin and all over Long Island.

Throughout the past 125 years, the membership of Hose Company No. 1 have had the privilege to serve under 82 Captains and proudly offered 22 members who would ultimately serve as Chief of Department.

In 1995, 201 was assigned to the Suffolk County wildfires and spent almost 3 days working throughout the pine barrens region.

Hose One, along with Hook & Ladder One, celebrated 100 years of service to the Baldwin community in 1996.

By the early 2000's, Hose Company One's roster was at the highest it had ever been, topping off with 33 members.

On May 18, 2011, we lost the second member of the Baldwin Fire Department in the Line of Duty. Ex-Captain Michael P. Esposito suffered a heart attack responding to a house fire at 2870 Grand Avenue (alarm # 11-0681). In 2021, the Board of Fire Commissioners approved Hose Company One's request to promote Michael posthumously to Honorary Chief.

The present active membership of the Company has taken great pride in following the example set in previous years by doing a thorough and efficient job in firefighting and training. We look forward to providing our services to the Baldwin community well into the future.

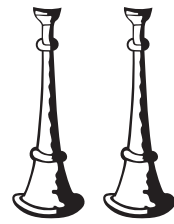

COMPANY HISTORY

Hose Company No. 2 was organized on January 20, 1913. George W. Miller was elected Foreman and William H. Gaillard, Secretary, with twenty-nine members sworn in. Charles Coakey, a local carpenter, built the firehouse in the summer of 1913 on property donated to the Baldwin Fire Department by the Baldwin Harbor Realty Company on Church Street and Verity Lane. In the fall of 1913, a minstrel show was conducted to raise funds for the Company. Thirty-five dollars and forty-five cents was raised. Valentine Johnson was appointed to see that the gaslight in front of the firehouse was lit each night. Plumber Wilbur Langdon installed a hot-air furnace for \$35.00. The firehouse was usually heated for three months of the year, December to February. A janitor was paid \$35.00 for his services. The house-warming party for the new firehouse, called a "smoker," was held on Saturday evening, March 7, 1914. The pipes and tobacco for the party cost \$4.75 and William R. Massie was chairman of the event. The bell on the Methodist Church on Church Street was used to signal fires. William Gaillard was elected and served as Chief for three years.

A carnival was run in July of 1914 and netted the Company \$274.10. That August, a committee was appointed to investigate the matter of acquiring an alarm system for Hose Company No. 2. An electric siren was tested and found to be unsatisfactory. A 36" steel alloy bell was purchased from Montgomery Ward and installed in the belfry of Hose Company No. 2's firehouse.

The first apparatus utilized by Hose Company No. 2 was a horse-drawn wagon with hose and ladders. The exact date that this apparatus was placed into service is unknown. However, a Company picture taken in 1915 illustrates Hose Company No. 2 in service with this type of apparatus. In February of 1916, Hose Company No. 2 appointed a committee with the power to purchase a Mercedes Simplex touring car with chain drive with four forward gears and two reverse gears. A butcher in Port Washington had converted this vehicle into a delivery truck. He had traded this car into the Ford

Motor Company for a Ford "pickup" truck. Eddie Bedell and William Massie went over to Port Washington and examined the car. They test drove the vehicle to Great Neck and back. They told the dealer it was a gamble to buy the car, as it would cost quite a bit to fix it up. They offered the dealer \$100.00 for the vehicle. The dealer wanted \$200.00 for the car, but when Eddie Bedell got through telling him what it would cost to put it in A-1 condition, they paid \$135.00 for it. The following is an excerpt from the history of B.F.D. Hose Company No. 2's first motor apparatus story by William R. Massie, Chairman of the Apparatus Committee:

This apparatus carried seven men. In July of 1919, a siren was purchased for Hose Company No. 2's apparatus for \$33.00. On August 8, 1921, a new GMC truck was approved for Hose Company No. 2 and put into service in the Fall of that year. The bell was removed from the old truck and put on the new GMC. In December of 1928, the fire district proposed a new firehouse, and the old firehouse was torn down. The fire truck was kept in Eckhardt's barn during construction. The new firehouse, as we know it today, was constructed at a cost of \$12,000. The new firehouse was opened in April of 1929 and the dedication took place in August. Hose Company No. 2 donated the old fire bell that rang atop the old firehouse to the Calvary Protestant church, where it remains to this day. In July of that year, the annual

At the September 1932 Company meeting, Hose Company No. 2 voted to start a first aid unit. The First Aid unit went into service in January of 1933. In May, Hose Company No. 2's Captain Howard Smith, appointed four men headed by Hose Company No. 2's member, Dr. Frank Musso, a local pharmacist, to respond to emergencies. Thanks to the dedication of the members of Hose Company No. 2, Baldwin at last had its first ambulance. The sick and injured no longer had to wait forty-five minutes for the Meadowbrook Hospital ambulance to respond. The First Aid Company was officially established in May of 1938 as a separate Company from Hose Company No. 2. Dr. Frank Musso was appointed its first

Captain with twelve members from other companies. They put into service a new 1938 Mack First Aid truck in June of that year, replacing the open-sided ambulance. It can be said that the members of Hose Company No. 2 are the “Fathers of First Aid.”

From these humble beginnings Hose Company Two has continued to grow. By the year 2021 The Company has continued to protect the entire town but will always be the “South House” as the members call it today as they protect the south end or Baldwin

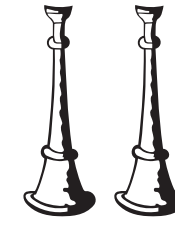

COMPANY HISTORY

In late November 1921, Leo Marsh met Charles Hoffman on Baldwin Avenue and, while passing the time of day, the two men discussed the purchase by Hose Company No.1 of a new piece of apparatus and the fact that the company intended to discard its old truck.

The discarding of this old piece of firefighting equipment was the deciding factor in the organization of Hose Company No. 3.

Therefore, on January 4, 1922, the first meeting was held to organize the new Company - to serve the area north of the railroad tracks - with Leo Marsh presiding. During the session, he was elected the Company's first Captain. Charles Hoffman was named Lieutenant; R. M. Priessnitz, Secretary; and Charles Forest, Treasurer.

The only place large enough to house a piece of fire apparatus in those days was Joe Krug's barn located on old Seaman Avenue, now known as St. Lukes Place. The barn stood near the present Browning Street. Back in the twenties, auto batteries were not up to present day standards and to prevent the truck battery from freezing in the unheated barn, it was kept in Krug's kitchen.

Shortly after the Company was organized, a meeting was held at which Lt. Hoffman, a builder by trade, was asked to submit plans and specifications for a new firehouse. In due time, the plan was approved and on October 27, 1923, a housewarming was held in the Company's new home on Baldwin Avenue.

In August 1923, the members decided to supplement their equipment with the purchase of a Ford semi-chemical wagon or drill car. The firemen raised their own money to buy this truck, which was sold in 1925.

Charter members of Hose Company No. 3 were: Leo Marsh, Charles Hoffman, H. M. DeWilde, William J. Robinson,

R. Priessnitz, William Koppke, Sr., Dennis Smith, Albert Caretto, Bernhard Paulsen, Marius Syvertsen, Charles Pfister, John Nieman, Albert Peterson, Charles Forest, and George Cheney.

The Board of Commissioners was petitioned in 1930 to include in the next year's budget funds for a new firehouse or improvements to the existing house. The board chose the latter and in 1932 Hose Company No. 3 was renovated by raising the original structure and building a new apparatus floor below. That was the first of many renovations to the original house. Hose Company No. 3's quarters were completely renovated again in 1976. These renovations, which were done almost entirely by the Company, included remodeling the meeting room, adding a third floor Captain's Office, and renovating the kitchen. Hose Company No. 3's quarters have been enjoyed by many members of the Department and the community over the years and have been, among other things, the site for Sunday School, the Garden Club, and even a couple of weddings. On Sunday mornings, the kitchen at Hose Company No. 3 continues to be a meeting place for members of all companies to share breakfast and camaraderie. Hose Company No. 3 dedicated the firehouse in April 2012 in honor of Ex-Chief Dominick Famularo.

An important part of Hose Company No. 3's activity, since its foundation, has been the Company Racing Team. The team has always enjoyed success, winning many tournaments, both old-fashioned and motorized, over the years. In the 1950's, the team, still motorized, raced with a "B" rig, built in quarters by Dom Famularo. Later in the 1960's, 70's, and 80's the team, the "Go Boys," were a successful old-fashioned team and twice held the State record in the Two into One event. The team has now merged with the Department Racing Team, the Tomcats.

The Company has always taken care of those in need and has supported and hosted several fundraisers for brother

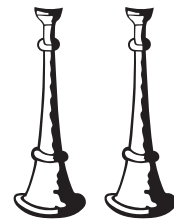

COMPANY HISTORY

On August 15, 1951, the Baldwin Board of Fire Commissioners authorized the formation of Hose Company No.4. as the need for additional protection in the northern most district of Baldwin was realized. Chief Charles Hoffman stated that a meeting would be held for this purpose with volunteers from the Department ranks as a nucleus. The old Ahrens Fox 1000-Gallon Pumper was assigned to Hose No.4 and was stored in Hose No.3's firehouse on Baldwin Avenue. This would be their headquarters until their new building was built at its present location in North Baldwin.

On September 19, 1951, a list of the newly elected officers was presented to the Fire Commissioner at their meeting and was accepted. It was at this meeting that they were officially declared a Company of the Baldwin Fire Department.

The membership was trained Firefighters of Hose Company Three and some from other Baldwin fire companies and area residents. The newly formed Northern most engine company firehouse was newly built on the intersection of Grand Avenue and Rose Boulevard in 1951. They responded with their used Ahrens Fox Fire Engine until their new state of the art 1955 Mack Thermodyne Fire Engine was purchased and put in service.

Hose Company Four (The Bull Dogs) today over twenty members strong has responded out of the Rose Boulevard Firehouse for the past seventy years with pride and excellence.

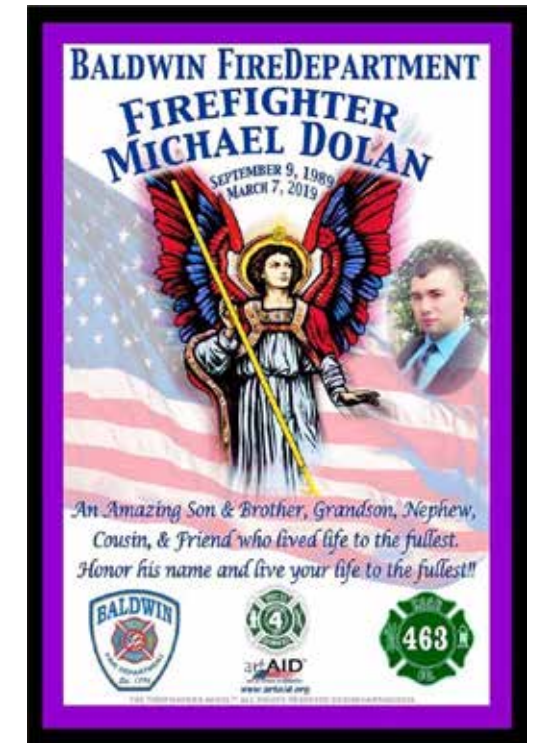
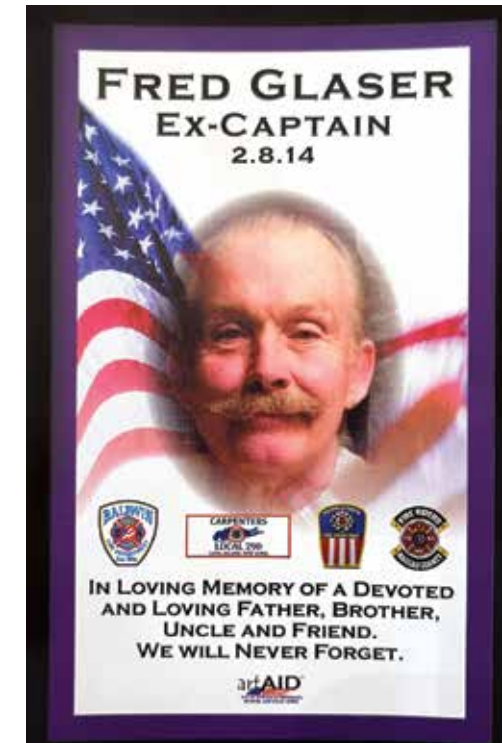

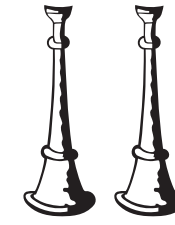

COMPANY HISTORY

On March 5th, 1896 the Baldwin Fire Department was formed with two fire companies, Hook and Ladder Co. 1 and Hose Co. 1. On March 5th, 1896, 40 residents became Charter members of Hook and Ladder Co. 1. They included; 2 Baldwin doctors, 1 pharmacist, and many prominent families of Baldwin, Bedell's, Carl's, Homan's, Miller's, Pettit's, Southard's, Story's, and Verity's just to name a few.

A total of 463 residents of Baldwin have served in the ranks of Hook and Ladder Co. 1. When the Department added additional fire companies, the members of Hook and Ladder Co. 1 became Charter members of these new companies and help train them in the practices of firefighting.

The first 2 Chiefs of the Baldwin Fire Department were from Hook and Ladder Co. 1. From the conception of the Department, 33 members of Hook and Ladder Co. 1 have been elected Chief of Department.

During these 125 years Hook and Ladder Co. 1 has been housed in the Headquarters building on the corner of Grand Ave. and Prospect Street. From this firehouse location, the members of the company have maintained 8 pieces of fire apparatus, from hand drawn, horse drawn and motorized. We are presently operating the Baldwin Fire Departments newest truck a 2020 Ferrara 100' aerial ladder.

The members along with the "fire trucks", they manned, have responded to alarms of fire, rescue and many calls for assistance. Hurricanes, flooding, auto accidents, Mutual Aid calls to assist our neighboring fire departments, removal of the citizens from all dangers caused by Mother Nature. During these many calls for "HELP", 26 members of Hook and Ladder Co. 1 were cited for Bravery Beyond the call of duty.

Many members of Hook and Ladder Co. 1 were called and served our country during World War 1, World War 2, The Korean War and The Viet Nam War.

Members of Hook and Ladder Co. 1 were the first members to be assigned and respond to the Terrorist Attacks at the World Trade Center.

In 1896 the first Chief of Department was from Hook and Ladder Co. 1, from 1896-1899 John H. Carl served. Here we are 125 years later, 2021. Chief of Department is from Hook and Ladder Co. 1, Timothy Hughes.

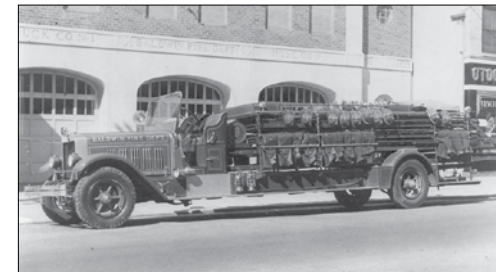

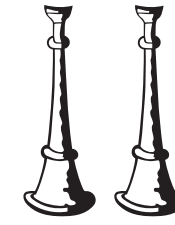

COMPANY HISTORY

On August 15, 1951, the Board of Fire Commissioners authorized the formation of Hook & Ladder Company No. 2. The “Organizational Meeting” was held at Headquarters on August 27, 1951 at which time the Captain and two Lieutenants were selected. A “Special Meeting” was held on September 10, 1951 to accept one more applicant. The six Charter Members included: George Bennett, Charles Corey, Anthony DeCesare, Robert Hill, Russell Newhall, and Henry Thielman. Hook & Ladder Company No. 2 was officially organized on September 19, 1951. The Company was assigned a 1930 American LaFrance. The Company met Headquarters until the new quarters at Grand Avenue and Rose Boulevard were completed in August of 1952.

Only one day after the Organizational Meeting, the members responded to their first call, August 28, 1951 at 3:40 PM, to the Sunset Rest Restaurant, Rose Blvd., and Grand Avenue. (Later known as Danny’s Haven). The first call the company responded to after it was officially formed was on September 28, 1951 at 11:30 PM to Milburn Avenue and Atlantic Avenue.

In 1955, the Company acquired a 75’ American LaFrance aerial ladder truck, today proudly displayed in the National Hall of Flame Museum in Phoenix Arizona. In 1980, the Company acquired another aerial truck, which was a 100’ American LaFrance rear mount “Water Chief.” The Company ran a 1991 Mack Baker 95’ Tower Ladder until 2015 when a new Seagrave 95-foot state of the art Tower Ladder was put into service with the newly inventoried Jaws of Life, air bag system, extrication and rescue tools as well as all standard Hook & ladder Company equipment.

Members of Ladder 2 Baldwin New York both past and present that took this great calling are always remembered and held in high regard. They are only one company of the seven companies in the Baldwin Fire Department. The Baldwin Fire Department, only one Department of seventy-one departments in Nassau County. They are only 30 of the 1,134,400 Firefighters in the United States today. Their allegiance to God and Country and the Fire Service leaves a legacy for all future generations to remember that the battle against fire and its hazards carries a heavy price and only the most persistent and courageous are willing to make the needed sacrifice to protect America from fire. As lesson learned and suffered with the line of duty death of Firefighter Stephan Barry on June 4th, 1976.

Hook & Ladder Company Two, aka “Ladder 2”, (Baldwin’s Bravest) continues to answer the alarm for structure fire, auto extrication, water rescue, hazardous-material incidents, and all type rescue operations not only in Baldwin but surrounding areas in Nassau County. Ladder 2 also was dispatched to ground zero on 9-11-01 a day which will live in every Americans memory as well as being assigned to the Rockaways NYC in days that followed.

Ladder Two has responded from their quarters on Grand Avenue and Rose Boulevard as a recognized and respected group of highly trained firefighters for the past seventy years.

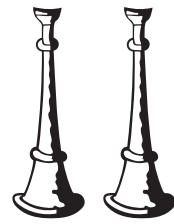

COMPANY HISTORY

The First Aid Company of the Baldwin Fire Department had its beginning on May 8, 1933, as a unit of Hose Company No. 2. Francis Musso, Claude Noon, and Harold Hancox were appointed members of the new rescue squad. They were sworn in by Chief Sal Sorrentino who spelled out their duties. These three became the nucleus of a team which was later expanded to company status of the Fire Department.

One year later, on March 12, Francis Musso was appointed Acting Lieutenant and charged with organizing a First Aid unit. Musso drew upon volunteers Arthur Hults, William H. Wright, Joseph Smidt, Richard Demerest, Donald Fisher, Claude Noon, Fred Gottlieb, and Charles Bedell as the Department's first official firstaidmen. Until 1938, the First Aid Rescue Squad was made up of volunteer firemen attached to Hose Company No. 2. Emergency calls during that period averaged 16 calls per year.

On May 16, 1938, the unit became a separate Company of the Department and had elected as officers Captain Francis Musso, Lieutenant Arthur Hults, Secretary Richard Demerest, and Treasurer Charles Brunner.

Since the humble beginning, when their first piece of apparatus was an old Graham-Paige sedan with the back seat chopped away and converted into a rescue truck, to the present where they are responsible to respond with three pieces of apparatus, two cardiac-equipped advance life support ambulances and a heavy rescue truck, Baldwin's First Aid Unit has made outstanding contributions in countless hours of community service and rendering aid and assistance.

Many members of the First Aid Company have risen from the ranks of firefighter to become Lieutenants and Captains. Several have reached the highest office, Chief of Department. Three members of the Company, the late Henry Wright, the late Roy Eckels, and Joseph C. Koch, have served the community as Fire Commissioners.

In June of 1938, the District acquired a new emergency truck. It made its first public appearance in the July 4th parade, which in those days was a community event much like Memorial Day is today. As the years went by, the Board of Fire Commissioners purchased new and modern equipment as it was developed. In 1954, a new GMC heavy duty rescue truck was purchased to replace the 1938 emergency truck. "BIG MOE," which it was lovingly called, was capable of handling most emergencies for those times. The District forefathers, the Commissioners, purchased the first ambulance in 1963. It was a Cadillac and was fully equipped with the most up to date first aid equipment available. It was given the radio designation "2010" and was placed into service on February 25th. The purchase of the ambulance increased the desire of the members of the First Aid Company to enhance their knowledge and further develop their emergency medical skills. Members at this time took First Aid classes given by the American Red Cross. As the years went by, the training was taken over by the Nassau County Fire/Police Academy. Members who participated in these programs graduated as Emergency Medical Technicians and paramedics, a certification recognized by the New York State Health Department.

Through the years since 1932, the First Aid Company has distinguished itself and has been awarded many group commendations as well as individual honors. An example of the dedication of its members, was the participation in rescuing the injured in the Long Island Railroad train wreck in Rockville Centre. Climbing into the overturned rail cars, the First Aid Company members worked together with doctors extricating people from the train. The late Roy Eckels was awarded a special life-saving commendation by the American Red Cross for restarting a cave-in victim's breathing. Other First Aid members Paul Cimino and Christopher Schwenker received the "Fireman of the Year" Award for their dedication and outstanding community service.

Since those early awards dozens of First Aid Company Medics have received “EMS awards of Excellence” for Pre-hospital saves. Others have received the coveted “Stalk Award” for the bringing life into the world and being in the right place at the right time. The First Aid Company also responded to ground zero on 9-11-01 during the city of New York’s greatest time of need. First Aid Company members have earned the admiration of their fellow firefighters, the firefighters from surrounding towns, and the gratitude of those people they have assisted in Baldwin over the decades.

The First Aid Company presently has 26 Emergency Medical Technicians, Paramedics and members in

training. Along with the other Companies which make up the Department, the First Aid Company is made up of individuals from all walks of life. There are city firefighters, doctors, nurses, schoolteachers, sanitary engineers, and businessmen who own stores right here in town and respond from their establishments when the alarm sounds. Dedication is mirrored by all members of the Company as they continue to retain their necessary certifications, keep up with the changing O.S.H.A. regulations, and maintain the highest level of obtainable skills available to better serve the Community of Baldwin. These life savers have been operating in the community of Baldwin for almost 90 years.

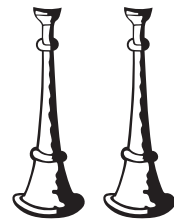

Currently, the advisors are Ex-Captain Mark Logan and Ex-Captain Thomas Yanantuono.

Since formation, the Junior Fire Department has participated in many competitive drills with other Junior

Fire Departments. Many times, Baldwin Juniors won First Place in total points in these competitions. In 1995, the Juniors won "Best Appearing Company" in the Baldwin Fire Department annual inspection, sharing this award with to other companies. Also in 1995, the Juniors again placed first in the Second Battalion Invitational parade in Point Lookout.

Members of the Juniors train with all companies in the Department. They are instructed with "hands on" training. Some of the topics that our members train on are: ground ladders, pump operation, hose line operations, search & rescue, forcible entry, rope rescue and repelling. All Junior firefighters are required to be CPR qualified, and are all currently certified.

January 2, 1996

Cots for standbys are in, 6 per company.

100 Years of Service of Hose Company One and Hook & Ladder One. Organized as the Baldwin Fire Department on January 25, 1896.

Commissioner Noble of Hose Three, on behalf of M. Schuh, presented council with an update of the Incident Command system. A draft document will be submitted to the Health & Safety Committee and Chiefs' Office for review and comment. The completed document will be submitted to the Board for approval. Part of the document includes establishment of a support staff to assist the Chiefs at an incident. The Chiefs' Office will coordinate with each company to identify individuals to serve a support staff. Comm. Noble advised that the ICS document and procedures will be evaluated and adjusted as needed.

Chief Bugler reported the Department is adopting an eleven-month training cycle. Finishing the training cycle at the end of November 1996.

During the years of his involvement, the Department has enjoyed great success in this field as indicated by the numerous awards and recognition bestowed upon the Department and its members. Purchase of a new Hurst tool dump valve approved.

Purchase of Eastern Communications service contract for 800 MHz radios approved.

District has begun issuing new face pieces as a result of the Fit Testing.

Chief Schuh asked about the status of the First Aid Firemedic Program. Chairman advised the Board approved full voting rights but kept the membership in the company at 45 members. Chief asked what percentage of the members Firemedics could be. Commissioner Yanantuono will investigate and report back. Chief will get the program started and report back to the Board.

Board voted to require all Class 1 & 2 Firefighters must get the medical through the District. Members under the age of 40 will be required to have a medical every two years and members 40 and over will be required to have a physical every year.

Be it resolved the Board of Fire Commissioners of the Baldwin Fire District endorses and supports the application for a grant for the cooperative purchase of a Bucket Truck by the Baldwin Union Free School District, the Baldwin Fire Department, and the Baldwin Sanitary District #2.

Be it also resolved the Board of Fire Commissioners of the Baldwin Fire District endorses and supports the subsequent cooperative purchase, maintenance, and repair of such vehicle.

April 4, 2000

Board voted to adopt a resolution for the expansion and rehabilitation of Headquarters.

Proposal from Schardt and Fullan for the computer rendering of the

proposed expansion and rehabilitation of Headquarters is approved.

Chief Schuh reported he was going to combine the Department Memorial Service with a service for the anniversary of Stephen Barry's death. The service would be on June 4, 2000.

The vote for the Bond to expand Headquarters is on May 11 and Chiefs asked to support the Bond resolution, as the expansion will benefit the Department as a whole.

Board advised the Chief the Board would be going to the BCA meeting on April 5, 2000, to present the project.

Board advised the Chief a letter was being sent out to each Department member advising them of the project and its scope.

Board reported George Waugh and Billy Coleman will be going to Oceanside to learn how to operate the gear cleaning equipment to relieve Oceanside personnel of this task.

Board voted to begin a 3-month pilot program using part time ambulance drivers during the day.

April 19, 2000

Board resolved it would seek lease/purchase financing for the two new pumper trucks in an amount not less than the final invoice for the balance due upon delivery, including credit for all advance payments made by the District, but no more than 100 % of the acquisition cost of both new pumper trucks including all related equipment attached to them.

Administrative Protocol for the Firemedic Program is accepted.

Commissioner Monahan suggested two new computers be purchased for the alarm room as the existing machines are not adequate.

Board reported the estimate for the new Engines for Hose Company Two and Four is \$370,000 each.

May 3, 2000

Board approved discontinuing the process of sending budget wish lists to Department Companies and Committees. Board instead will instruct the Chief to advise all Department Companies and Committees to submit items they need at any time during the year on the standard Fire Department Requisition Form.

Bid proposal for the lighting project at Fireman's Field and the notice to bidders was placed in the paper on April 28, 2000. The bid opening is scheduled for May 16, 2000.

Chief McElynn was approved to select a committee for the Second Battalion in his year. Committee should be submitted to the Board for review.

May 10, 2000

Chief Schuh asked for the numbers of those who would be attending the Department Memorial Services, June 4th at St. Christopher's.

Good & Welfare: Captain Kopf reported that the "Hall of Flame of Phoenix" is sponsoring a barbecue this Friday evening at Rose

Boulevard, to kick off the cross-country journey of the old "207" to the museum in Phoenix, and that all Department members are welcome to attend.

May 23, 2000

One bid for the lighting project at Fireman's Field was received. The bid was for \$42,979 and everything was in order.

The Board of Fire Commissioners reported the Cleary Building sale was closed.

Attorney Dougherty reported he and the attorneys from Rockville Centre appeared at Court and the Law Secretary told them all to settle the case. He will draft a letter to be sent to TGI Friday's informing them they will be moved into the Baldwin Fire District and hopes to get the matter settled.

Attorney Dougherty reported the bid for the two pumpers has been published and the bid opening is scheduled for June 7, 2000.

Chief Schuh advised the Board he was going to be implementing a policy where a company must show up at the scene of a call with at least three members dressed in gear. Chairman reported that the Board would support the Chief in his policy.

June 6, 2000

Report from the Radio Committee was approved with minor modifications. The new radios will be distributed as follows:

Each ladder company will receive 1 MT2000 radio (old). These radios are spares and will be kept for use by the ladder companies until such time that they are needed to replace an out of service radio. Total of 24 new MT750 radios and 4 new MT1250 radios

Board approved the purchase of a new District utility van, the purchase of a new Chief's car (Ford Explorer) and the sale of the old ambulance, old District van and the retired Chief's car. The Chief's car and utility van will be purchased from the New York State bid. The utility van will be purchased in a color to differentiate it from fire department vehicles.

Attorney Dougherty advised bids for two pumper trucks were received from RD Murray and Pierce Fire Apparatus Supply. RD Murray submitted a bid of \$684,828. Pierce Fire Apparatus Supply submitted a bid of \$667,000. Attorney Dougherty advised both parties he would be reviewing the bids and specifications and the District would be contacting both bidders to advise them who will be awarded the contract.

June 14, 2000

Communications Committee: It was reported there are 28 new radios that have been approved for the Department, however they are waiting to meet with the salesperson to close the deal.

July 6, 2000

Attorney Dougherty reported one bid was received for the additional

work on the lighting project at Fireman's Field. The bid for the first part of the project was \$42,979 and the second part was \$22,396. Attorney Dougherty will prepare a Permissive Referendum for \$65,000 for the lighting project. The funds will come from the Capital Construction Repair Reserve account.

Attorney Dougherty reported he will prepare a Permissive Referendum for the purchase of the new radios in the amount of \$25,000. The funds will come from the Apparatus/Equipment Reserve account.

A Permissive Referendum in the amount of \$35,000 for a new Chief's car. The funds will come from the Apparatus/Equipment Reserve account.

As an immediate measure Automatic alarms will remain as a District response but any alarms within the four walls of a building shall be a General Alarm, and all District alarms will be a minimum of two engine response.

July 12, 2000

Junior Fire Department: Chief Schuh introduced Adam Katz as the new advisor to the Junior Fire Department. Adam then reported that the Jr.'s held their Officer Elections, which resulted in the following outcome:

August 1, 2000

Board advised the Chiefs ID pictures would be taken on August 12, 2000, at the Second Battalion Parade.

Board advised the Chief the radio pockets are going to be sewn on gear for all Class 1 & 2 Firefighters as needed. The process should take approximately 2 days.

Board suggested a committee be established to consider the use of the Hurst tool and investigate the use of a Thermal Imaging camera. The committee will be composed of two members each from Ladder Company One and Two and one member from the Training Committee.

Board approved removing the King Fisher system from service when other arrangements are made by the School District and the Sanitation District.

Board will consider purchasing two smaller Hurst tool units to place on each Ladder truck since unit 208 is not getting out to calls. Board approved investigating the proposal.

August 9, 2000

Communications Committee: Captain Kenny reported that the new radios are in and that the District will be sewing on the new radio pockets to the turnout coats in the very near future. All Class 1, 2 & 5 firefighters must have these pockets affixed to their gear or will be dropped to Class 6 FF.

MINUTES OF SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING OF THE BALDWIN FIRE DEPARTMENT

The regular semi-Annual meeting of the Baldwin Fire Department was called to order at 8:14 PM, at Rose Boulevard Firehouse, Chief Neville presiding.

Captain Wiedmann of Hose 3 led salute to the flag.

There was a moment of silence for all our departed brothers.

Chief Neville asked the Secretary to read aloud the two proposed By-Law changes, Proposition One and Proposition Two. He then stated there are enough members present for a quorum and we would take a one-hour recess for the purpose of voting on the proposed By-Law changes.

At 9:28PM, Chief Neville reconvened the meeting and continued with the order of business until the votes were counted.

There was then a motion by R. Beam, seconded by G. Fitzgerald that we dispense with the reading of the minutes of the Annual meeting. Motion carried.

Good & Welfare: It was reported that R. Ellison Sr. of Hose 1 was doing well and is presently at the Westchester Medical Center, room 715, in Valhalla N.Y. if anyone was interested in seeing him.

Chiefs' Remarks: Chief Neville thanked the Department for all the help and support that it showed to him and his deputies over the past 6 months. He stated there is nothing in the By-Laws pertaining to whether there should or should not be an absentee ballot for a By-Law change, but they were available for this vote. Anyone interested needed to ask his/her Captain to contact the Department Secretary and one would have been provided.

Change from: Article IV, Section 5

Should members at any time change their address and thereby move outside the confines of the Baldwin Fire District, the members shall forfeit their membership in the Company and the Department, unless they are retained under Section 1 of this Article. The member shall return all Company, Department and District property in their possession to their Company Captain. Should such members, at a future date, move back into the limits of the Baldwin Fire District, the members may, upon written application, be reinstated as an active member of their Company or any other Company of the Department, subject to normal voting procedure on their applications. (Also see Section 6 of this Article) The members may do so without having to pay an initiation fee. Such applicants for reinstatement must have been clear of all charges at the time of their severance and submit to physical examination by the Department Surgeon. Negative physical reports shall disqualify the applicants.

Change to: Article IV, Section 5

Should members at any time change their address and thereby move outside the confines of the Baldwin Fire District, the members shall forfeit their membership in the Company and the Department unless they are retained under Section 1 of this Article, or he/she moves to one of the five communities which geographically border the Baldwin Fire District. (Freeport, Roosevelt, South Hempstead, Rockville Centre, Oceanside). The member must meet all call, drill, meeting, and activity requirements. If the member retained under Article IV, Section 1 or Article IV, Section 5 fails to meet the minimum requirements for a calendar year, he/she shall be dropped from the rolls.

The member shall return all Company, Department and District property in their possession to their Company Captain. Should such members, at a future date, move back into the limits of the Baldwin Fire District, the members may, upon written application, be reinstated as an active member of their Company or any other Company of the Department subject to normal voting procedure on their applications. (Also see Section 6 of this Article) The members may do so without having to pay an initiation fee. Such

applicants for reinstatement must have been clear of all charges at the time of their severance and submit to physical examination by the Department Surgeon. Negative physical reports shall disqualify the applicants.

Individuals affected by this change prior to its instatement date would be grandfathered.

Secretary Brown provided Board with job description for the proposed position working for Board.

Due to the events of September 11, 2001, the September 2001 Council was cancelled.

September 16, 2001

MINUTES OF SPECIAL DEPARTMENT MEETING OF THE BALDWIN FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Special Meeting of the Baldwin Fire Department was called to order at 8:05PM, at Rose Boulevard Firehouse, Chief Neville presiding.

At this time, Chief Neville opened the meeting by thanking everyone for coming out to this meeting on such short notice. He then made the following statement.

"I would like to say once again, thank you for your efforts and professionalism shown thus far during this disaster.

I know there is not a person in this room, who was not touched in some way by this attack. Our thoughts and prayers are not only with those gone or unaccounted for, but also with those who still toil, searching through the rubble for the victims of this terrible assault on our nation.

This would appear to be a long and difficult operation, and I know the men and woman of this Department stand ready to assist those in need. However, I again ask, as I did on Thursday evening, that we stand ready until such time that we are requested through proper channels.

Thank you again, and may God bless us, and watch over our nation in the difficult days ahead."

Lt. Jazylo of Ladder 2 led salute to the flag

Chief Neville then asked the Department to remain standing as Secretary Slover read a short prayer for the victims of the World Trade Center terrorist attack that occurred this past Tuesday morning, September 11, 2001.

He then asked we remain standing for a moment of silence for all our brother and sister emergency services personnel, as well as all the civilians lost in the Trade Center attack.

Monsignor Bennett then reflected on the promotions made today of the 168 FDNY Firefighters, who moved up to replace those lost in this disaster, and the emotions some may encounter for moving up the chain of command in a time of such horror. He further stated we, the members of this Department, have been promoted in some small and obscure way by this experience also.

Chief Neville reminded the membership any Department member attending a funeral or any service for victims of the World Trade Center attack may wear their Class "A" Uniform. He went further by stating he encourages our attendance at these services, especially since the continuing search operations and modified work schedules will make it difficult for many FDNY firefighters to attend those services. He stated he encourages our members to attend any prayer or memorial services held by other Fire Departments. "We, the Baldwin Fire Department rank and file, were left virtually untouched by this tragedy. I would like to see us support some of those departments who were not so lucky. Although notification of these events may come on short notice, we will make every effort to accommodate with transportation, those members wishing to attend."

Chief Neville then stated there will be a Nassau County Firefighters Ecumenical Prayer Service Wednesday evening, September 19th, at 2000 hrs. at St. Christopher's Church in Baldwin. He stated we as a Department have been asked to help coordinate certain aspects of the operation. He asked individuals who wish to assist to please see one of their company officers so they can take their names and have assignments handed out to them on Wednesday afternoon and or evening. He further stated this is a prayer service and not a memorial service and there will be no line or march into the church, and no reserved seating. First come, first seated. The Department will be Out of Service from 1900 hrs. until 2200 hrs. and members are asked to be in Class "A" Uniforms. He asked for everyone's help and cooperation, and then opened the floor for any questions.

Having no further business to discuss at this time, the meeting was duly adjourned at 2015 hrs. after a motion by Ex-Chief J. Bugler, seconded by Ex-Captain R. Hachemeister. Motion carried.

Administrator Harron informed the Board the Nassau County conference on Special Districts was scheduled for June 8, 2006, at Hofstra University.

Supervisor Brown provided the Board with the job specifications for Firehouse Maintainer.

Supervisor Brown reported during the walkthrough with VFIS they identified several property structures which were not covered by the policy. The rep recommended everything inside of the house at 720 Baldwin Avenue be removed and it should be checked daily because it is considered a high hazard building. Chairman Yanantuono directed

Supervisor Brown to work with Commissioner Wiedmann to go through the building and determine what needs to be saved and dispose of the rest.

Supervisor Brown reported the state bid for the Chief's Chevy Tahoe is \$27,000 with the cost of the light package, radios and cabinet will cost approximately \$33,500.

Board accepted the bid of \$263,000 from Fidele Construction for the interior renovation at Hose Company Three firehouse and authorized a Permissive Referendum in the amount of \$350,000 with the funds to be taken from the Capital Construction and Repair Reserve account.

June 5, 2018

Board approved the request from Hook and Ladder Company One to host a 125th Anniversary Parade in 2021.

June 19, 2018

Contractor began work on Hose Company Three backroom today, so unit 2033 has been relocated to sanitation garage. District needs to provide an air compressor to keep the truck's air system charged.

July 24, 2018

Commissioner Douglas Wiedmann elected Chairman of the Board. Ex-Chief Edward Mullen appointed as Chief of Fire Inspectors. Ex-Chief Kevin Smith appointed as Chief of Fire Prevention. Ex-Chief Thomas FitzSimons was appointed Chairman of Safety Committee.

Board approved hiring John Marino and John Briguglio as Firehouse Maintainers, effective January 2, 2019.

March 19, 2019

April 2, 2019

Attorney Dougherty reported he published notice of special election on March 23, 2019, for the Mandatory Referendum for the approval to purchase new aerial ladder and to sell old unit 206.

April 17, 2019

Department Open House for recruitment scheduled for Sunday morning April 28th.

2019 Department Picnic date is August 24th at Firemen's Field.

May 7, 2019

Board directed Supervisor Moore to obtain 3 sets of gear from Global and Morning Pride to pilot. He will ask Chief Peter Ortiz to decide who from each company should be selected to pilot the new gear.

Chief Ortiz reported on the South Hempstead request for an automatic mutual aid request for an engine for all residential and commercial phone in alarms. He stated come January they would probably be asking for a ladder truck as well.

Chief Ortiz advised the Board he has let each company know that as of June 1, 2019, he would be working for the Baldwin Fire District and therefore must step down as Chief of the Department, however he would continue to assist the remaining Chiefs in the Chief's office. Commissioner Quackenbush reported he asked Supervisor Moore to investigate upgrading the lights on the memorial at the Rose Boulevard firehouse to LED. The cost would be approximately \$2000.

May 21, 2019

June 12, 2019

Board approved hiring four EMT's for the District medic pool as of September 1, 2019.

August 20, 2019

Attorney Dougherty reported the Permissive Referendum for the Toughbook laptops for the ambulances will be placed in Newsday on Friday for \$40,000.

Hose Company One request to attend muster with the Fox and use of the Department bus on September 7, 2019, in Southampton approved.

Hook & Ladder Company One truck committee asked to have an additional trip to the factory after the chassis is completed, possibly 4 or 5 members. Board approved.

NY American Water grant of \$1,000 has been approved and they would like to come to the Board to present the check.

September 3, 2019

Administrator Harron recommended spreading the replacement of Windows 10 computers over the next two years. She would provide a schedule accordingly.

Board approved the list of shop equipment for approximately \$40,000. Permissive Referendum for funds from the Apparatus and Equipment Reserve account.

Board approved the purchase of the ESO E-PCR program at a cost of \$5,735.56. There also is a recurring annual cost of \$5,200.00.

Commissioner Eckels reported he will arrange for a photographer to come in during the Department meeting to take new member photos for the 125th anniversary.

September 11, 2019

There was a moment of silence for the 343 Firefighters, 60 Police Officers, 8 Medical Technicians and Fire Patrolmen who perished 18 years ago this day performing the largest rescue effort in American history. Over 15,000 people owe their lives to their sacrifice.

October 1, 2019

Bid opening for the new storage building at Headquarters was held on September 27, 2019, and 12 bids were received. The lowest bidder was Metro Group at \$1,011,000.00. Their bid was in order and has been sent to H2M for review.

Request from the Chiefs' Office to have the Alarm Room send out a daily test text message approved. Supervisor Moore will direct the dispatchers accordingly.

Board approved the sale of unit 206 to Fire Command for the cost of \$95,000 pending review of final contract.

Supervisor Moore reported Lonnie Green submitted a letter with request for four items that will now be required by the NYS Department of Health for District personnel and volunteers.

Supervisor Moore recommends policy for providing second hood to all members be revised to have the District maintain inventory of spare clean hoods and carry them on the SCBA van. He discussed this with Ex-Chief FitzSimons and Chief Streithorst and they agree with this proposal. Board approved.



First Deputy Chief Streithorst reported there are two members with 50 years of service and is asking how they should be handled. Ex-Captain William Marmo, Sr. has already completed 50 years of service and Ex-Captain Frank Slover will achieve his 50 years in 2019

Chairman Wiedmann advised that each member becomes Honorary Chief and get their gold Honorary Chief's badge. The badges would be given out at the Department meeting.

Commissioner Eckels reported he got the Town of Hempstead to make up 12 membership recruitment signs to be installed around town. October 9, 2019

The new decontamination unit is being installed this week to allow cleaning of as many as 24 pieces of turnout gear at a time.

Individual photos of all members, for the 125th Anniversary Journal, at the department meeting in December, Class "A" uniform needed.

November 5, 2019

Board authorized a Permissive Referendum to outfit the new IT Data Closet at Headquarters in the amount of \$25,000 with the funds coming out of the Apparatus and Equipment Reserve account.

Board accepted the bid from Metro Group of Long Island Inc. in the amount of \$1,011,775 for the construction of the new storage building behind Headquarters.

Supervisor Moore reported it is not safe for the District to demolish the white trailer, therefore he recommends getting estimates. He will confer with Sanitary District 2 to see if they can assist. Board approved.

Supervisor Moore reported the gear cleaning room is up and running and they can accommodate 15 sets of gear in 24 hours. The only issue is with drying of the gloves, so they are investigating a resolution.

Request from the South Hempstead Fire Department to have Baldwin Fire Department send an engine and ladder on all alarms with a report of fire and 2nd Respond to all automatic alarms from 7:00AM to 4:00PM for Covert Elementary School at 379 Willow Street, and Grand Avenue Elementary School at 711 School Drive, approved by the Board.

Supervisor Moore reported the new ambulance committee recommended purchasing a Porta Count. Board authorized committee to investigate further.

Supervisor Moore reported the new ambulance committee recommended purchasing the Lucas Device, for automatic CPR. Board authorized committee to investigate further.

Supervisor Moore reported he worked with the Chief to develop a plan for handling potential coronavirus cases, and they agreed it would go out as a signal 45. Chairman McDermott asked if the NCPD needs to be made aware of this. Supervisor Moore stated it was just an advisory, and to proceed with caution.

February 12, 2020

The new radio signal 45 has been approved by the Board of Fire Commissioners. This will be used on Signal 9's to advise responding personnel they may be responding to a possible communicable disease.

Effective immediately, we will be responding with the South Hempstead Fire Department as a dual response with 1 Engine and 1 Ladder on all phone alarms for structural fires, also to automatic alarms from 7:00AM to 4:00PM to either the Grand Avenue or Covert Schools. Alarm will be toned out following regular Department Mutual Aid procedure.

February 18, 2020

Request from Hose Company Two to upgrade the portable ladders on their apparatus due to the number of homes in the south raised after flooding, approved.

Supervisor Moore reported he received initial estimates to replace the wood floor in Headquarters' meeting room and is estimated at \$42,000. After some discussion, it was determined that Milburn Flooring is under State bid.

March 11, 2020

Chief Streithorst spoke on the issue of Corona Virus and what the department is doing to keep our members safe.

On March 14, 2020, Baldwin will cover So. Hempstead from 1800 to 0600 hrs. Mutual Aid will be transmitted as 1 Engine, 1 Truck from town.

March 16, 2020

Due to the ongoing Coronavirus pandemic, the Board held the meeting early to discuss the impact to the Department and District. The Board and Chiefs approved closing all firehouses to members unless they are responding to alarms and EMS calls. Discussion of proper protocols and safety of individuals is priority.

Supervisor Moore reported he will be purchasing emergency supplies as needed for the Department and District and will advise.

Board approved the proposed plan of Supervisor Moore to adjust the work hours of the employees to ensure the continued operations of the District and to have better social distancing during COVID19.

Board approved MetroGroup of Long Island to begin the HQ garage project. MetroGroup will not have access to HQ during the construction.

April 21, 2020

Administrator Harron reported the scheduled physicals to date have been canceled and the upcoming physical on May 20, 2020, will be as well. The next date is June 23, 2020, and she will hold onto that for the time being. Recommended scheduling two additional dates in the future to have dates reserved. Board approved.

Chairman McDermott asked District Administrator Harron to check with Dr. Basri to see what his thoughts are on conducting antibody testing of members.

Board asked District Administrator Harron to investigate the cost of purchasing Zoom for use by the Board and the Department to host meetings. District Administrator Harron reported it would cost \$15 per month for up to 100 users. The Board approved the purchase of Zoom video conference for the District.

Supervisor Moore reported the new unit 206 has been completed, however, he advised them we will not accept the truck until we can conduct an inspection.

Board authorized Supervisor Moore to continue coverage of District medics on the weekends through the end of the month and then returned to normal Monday to Friday schedule.

Board asked Supervisor Moore if he thought it was necessary to continue with the current staff working different shifts. FEMA has 15 ambulances and the Nassau County Police have added ambulances to handle the transportation of suspected Coronavirus patients.

May 21, 2020

The meeting was held in the main meeting hall at Headquarters so all attendees could maintain proper social distancing.

Board approved a Permissive Referendum in the amount of \$58,000 for the purchase of a new District Pickup Truck, with the funds to come out of the Apparatus and Equipment Reserve account. Notice of Permissive Referendum to be published in the paper.

Board approved initial offer of \$30,000 to purchase the parcel of land for use with the Headquarters storage garage.

Administrator Harron reported on the claim for COVID-19 related expenses. To date the amount of our claim is \$46,000. None of the costs associated with volunteer calls are eligible.

Supervisor Moore received the estimate to install hardwood flooring in Hose Company One and First Aid Company rooms. Board approved.

Board approved the fees of \$2,935 to gold leaf and chrome equipment for the Fox.

Chief Streithorst reported he was moving the first Council to Headquarters to use the main meeting hall for social distancing.

Chief Streithorst reported he will be sending out an email to members regarding plans to begin re-opening the firehouse.

Commissioner Eckels noted there would be training on new unit 206 on June 12-14, 2020, for chauffeurs and it should be added to the calendar.

New Ladder truck is set for delivery on May 29.

Commissioner Eckels provided Secretary Brown with a copy of the specification for a new 2020 Chevy Silverado 2500 for use by District Mechanic.

June 2, 2020

Board of Fire Commissioners has approved hazardous response of \$3000 per company for call response during the COVID19 pandemic putting them at risk for potential hazards, interacting with employees, residents, and members from the period of March 16, 2020, through June 1, 2020.

Board approved a Permissive Referendum in the amount of \$130,000 for the blacktop paving of the lot at Fireman's Field. Funds to be drawn from the Capital Construction Reserve Account.

Board approved the painting of Headquarters by Integral Home Design for a total of \$24,750.00. Payments to come from the General Fund. Partial payment of 25% to be paid prior to start to purchase supplies.

June 10, 2020

A moment of silence for our departed member Norman Abrams who passed away during the COVID-19 Pandemic.

Chief Streithorst stated both his office and 2nd Battalion were very busy providing numbers for the county and state during the COVID-19 pandemic, and they are receiving dates and times for planned protests at this time.

Chief Streithorst reported he and Supervisor Moore met with representatives of SCOTT SCBA, and it looks like the department will be staying with them for our choice of SCBA. This year there will be no FIT Tests or medicals.

McNeil Learning module is up and running On-Line, good way to get some Training credits.

State Senators have approved a bill to give each member 5 points per month towards LOSAP during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Headquarters company rooms, meeting hall, and training room will be closed on July 7th until the beginning of August, for floor replacement and painting.

Each company received a check from the Board expressing their THANKS to all during the COVID-19 pandemic. Many members and their families sacrificed a lot during this time and the Board felt this was a very small way to say THANK YOU. Chief reported that the checks presented were in the amount of \$3,000.00 per company.

June 16, 2020

Board asked Administrator Harron to send a letter to Hose Company Four and Ladder Company Two that Board will be using their hall for the July 7 Board meeting.

Board voted to cancel the 2020 department medicals as the full NFPA 1582 standard not being completed due to COVID19. Other options for 2021 will be considered.

July 7, 2020

Attorney Dougherty reported Permissive Referendums for the SCBA upgrade (\$600,000) and the paving at Fireman's Field (\$130,000) were published in Newsday on June 15, 2020.

Board asked Administrator Harron to send an email to the First Aid Company and Chiefs that members wanting to get tested for COVID19 can go to CityMD or Jones Beach.

Board requested Administrator Harron prepare a notice to members the meeting halls will remain closed through the end of September and will be reviewed again for compliance with NYS.

Board approved the purchase of Command Boards for use with Department alarms at a cost of \$4000 per unit.

July 8, 2020

August 18, 2020

The sale of unit 206 has been finalized and the truck has been delivered and we received 2 checks.

Letter from Chiefs' Office requesting four hours of standby for tropical storm Isaias approved.

Administrator Harron reported the District received notice from NY American Water of substantial increase in the cost per hydrant which she reflected in her budget report to Treasurer Brown. The increase was from \$242 to \$256 per hydrant.

Chief Streithorst recommended the District consider getting face masks/coverings with Department logo to be given to each member, so they have a mask available.

September 1, 2020

Board approved the Chiefs' request to suspend the 20% call average for 2020 due to COVID19.

Benevolent Association is considering donating \$250,000 to build a structure with bathrooms at Fireman's Field to use for their meeting purposes. Plans are being reviewed.

Board approved a Permissive Referendum in the amount of \$400,000 for the renovation of the Alarm Room for purchase of equipment with funds coming from the Apparatus Equipment Reserve account. Work to be performed by All Service Controls.

September 9, 2020

Chief Streithorst reported the 2nd Battalion will be holding their first meeting since January on September 23rd, and only 1 Chief and 1 Delegate may attend.

Chief Streithorst reported the SCBA committee met, and we will be staying with "SCOTT" at this time.

Chief Dworsak reported the picnic has been postponed until next year.

September 22, 2020

Administrator Harron provided update on the NYS Legislation regarding LOSAP points for members during the period the firehouses were closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. District can award 5 points to member per month that firehouse was closed. Reported

the resolution can be adopted up until April 2021, therefore she recommends waiting to see if there would need to be anymore closures of the firehouse in the coming months.

October 6, 2020

Chairman McDermott reported the Chiefs need to provide details on how the Department Election will be carried out with current guidelines due to COVID19. The Board agreed it should be submitted for the October 20 meeting.

October 14, 2020

Commissioner McDermott handed out personal protection masks for all company members, to be used at the firehouse and at calls. He spoke about the newly designed Department Patch that needs to be placed on everyone's uniform jacket and he will arrange to collect and return the jackets.

Chief Streithorst reported the County is hosting free COVID-19 testing in Baldwin Park from October 12th to October 16th, from 1000 hrs. till 1800 hrs. He gave each company information on how to quarantine or isolate oneself if they test POSITIVE for COVID-19.

It was reported Fireman's Field will be closed for the next 2 weeks due to construction being done.

Ladder 2 asked about the new Command Boards both Truck Companies received, and who is responsible for them and who may use them. Chief Streithorst stated a written procedure is being prepared.

October 20, 2020

Board approved issuing a Permissive Referendum in the amount of \$45,000, with the funds coming from the Capital Construction and Repair Reserve Fund for design of new building at Fireman's Field by Cashin Associates.

November 3, 2020

A letter of commitment was sent to the Benevolent Association for the \$250,000 donation towards the Field House at Fireman's Field. Benevolent Association will meet next week, and the District awaits their approval.

Updated COVID19 policy approved and will be posted in firehouses. Chief Candidate breakfasts are cancelled due to COVID19.

Council Dinner cancelled due to COVID19.

Board approved the Pandemic Response Protocol required by New York State.

Chairman McDermott discussed the proposed plan submitted regarding the Department meeting and election. Board agreed only Board, Chiefs, tellers, and candidates will be in the meeting hall to swear in the new Deputy Chief.

Board approved the purchase of 65 NFPA approved Scott X3 Pro SCBA plus spare cylinders, air pack and pack trackers in the amount of \$600,000. Funds to cover purchase from the Apparatus and Equipment Reserve account.

November 11, 2020

Fire school is over and time to have gear cleaned and harnesses put back on.



Chief Streithorst reported they are currently putting together a new COVID 19 policy which is being sent to the BOFC for their approval.

T. FitzSimons informed all the T.O.H. is hosting free COVID-19 testing in Oceanside on November 16th through the 20th.

Chief Streithorst reported the BOFC has approved the purchase of new SCBA's.

Chief Streithorst stated to expect cancellations and modifications to many of the upcoming events due to the COVID-19 infections. Some of these will be the candidate breakfasts, December Council dinner, and if the County or State begin lockdowns again, Department Election ballots may be mailed out and it will be the responsibility of the individual to return it in person to Headquarters, place to be announced.

Chief Streithorst reviewed the current procedure for the Department meeting. It will be Department Officers, Commissioners, "ONE" company representative, the 3rd Deputy Candidates, and the election committee in attendance. Board Approved.

Santa Rides will be approved provided strict enforcement of Social Distancing adhered to by all those participating.

November 17, 2020

Adhering to COVID19 restrictions, Board approved issuing \$250.00 to each company as the annual Department meeting was not held with full attendance.

Commissioner Quackenbush reported the 9/11 memorial at Rose Boulevard Firehouse had to replace the stone utilized initially, which allowed water to leak from the memorial. The original contractor has come back and has completed the repair without cost. Commissioner Quackenbush also proposed some modifications to the existing memorial to correct some layout issues with the original design.

Commissioner Wiedmann reported he received proposal from H2M to repair the front wall and balcony at Hose Company Three quarters for approximately \$250,000. He will review this further before presenting it to the Board.

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Baldwin Fire Department.

"FOR HISTORICAL PURPOSES ONLY"

The "COVID-19" Pandemic of 2020 brought about many challenges and experiences for the Chiefs, Officers, and District Administrators to deal with during the year. In late February early March 2020, the pandemic started to raise its ugly head. In mid- March, Governor Andrew Cuomo started to shut down the state. This included shutting down bars, restaurants, shopping malls, houses of worship, all unessential businesses, limiting public transportation, asking people to confine themselves to their homes for at least two weeks, and placing a limit of 25 persons or less to be gathered in any one place at any one time, just to name some of the things asked of all.

In following the Governor's rules, Chief Streithorst ordered all firehouses closed except to respond to calls, return to quarters, and leave immediately. No socializing, no meetings of any sort was our way of life for the next two and a half months. The only business being performed was the essential business of the day. In early June things started to ease up, and we gradually started to resume what was referred to as the "New Normal", which included mandatory wearing of face masks, which covered your mouth and nose when you left the confines of your home, keeping six feet apart of others if possible, or limiting yourself to fifteen minutes of personal contact with another individual.

That now brings us to this evening where changes were made to adhere to some of the restrictions we must work within. Fourteen days before the night of the election, the decision was made to mail out paper ballots to all those eligible to vote, and then have everyone return them to the Department Secretary before the night of the elections. The night of the department meeting and elections, the 80-member quorum was abolished. Only twenty-nine people would be allowed to be present at the department meeting. They were seated in groups at tables that adhered to the six foot "Social Distancing" guidelines. Those present included the four chiefs, the department secretary and treasurer, five commissioners, department chaplain, the seven company captains or company representative, the two candidates for 3rd deputy chief, the seven election tellers and the district administrator who provided the remainder of the membership with a means to log into a computer link to view the results from their home or a TV in their company rooms.

"Two new terms for describing life in 2020"

The senior member of the department this evening, Thomas FitzSimons, led the Department in a salute to our flag.

There was then a moment of silence for our departed brothers Honorary Chief Norman Abrams, Ex-Chief Jack Coughlan, and Ex-Chief Robert Deutsch.

Fr. Nicholas Zientarski, our Department Chaplain, led us in an invocation.

Report of the Election Committee was 170 ballots distributed:

With the results of the Chief's election completed, Commissioner Quackenbush swore in the newly elected Deputy Chiefs for the year 2021, Deputy Chiefs Brien Cummings, William Dworsak, and Anthony Hopkins.

Commissioner McDermott swore in the 2021 Chief of the Department, Timothy Hughes.

Chief Hughes took this opportunity to thank the department for electing him to the position of Chief of the Department, and especially for the 125th Anniversary of the Department. He then congratulated all the incoming officers for the year 2021 and wished them good luck. He stated he looks forward to working with the BOFC and with their help and support, is looking forward to a great year. In closing he thanked those Chiefs he served under during the past three years, Mike and Pete and expressed a special thank you to Lee, and congratulated Anthony for winning this year's election and is looking forward to working with him in the year to come.

M. Peletier reported the Veteran's Association was disbanding the organization and they have about \$4,000.00 in their treasury. The Association decided they would split the money in half, giving \$1,950 to the Barry Fund and the \$1,950 to the Michael Esposito Fund.

Ex-Chief Schwenker was appointed Vice Chairman of the Safety Committee of the Baldwin Fire Department.

January 13, 2021

Due to the ongoing pandemic, and the amount of department personnel infected or recovering from it, the BOFC has temporarily closed the department down, members only being allowed to respond to calls. Because of that, Chief Hughes has decided to "ZOOM" with the seven captains or company representative, and the Chiefs' Office, and thus allow the regular monthly meeting of the Baldwin Fire Council to be held, via the internet.

Chief Hughes stated to keep the trucks clean and ready to go, he is allowing two members from each company the time to perform maintenance on their vehicles, Sunday mornings between 0900 & 1100 hrs, and Monday evenings between 1900 & 2100 hrs. You must however first notify the Chief of who those individuals are going to be.

February 9, 2021

Department medicals dates for 2021 can be scheduled now that most members have gotten vaccinated.

Commissioner Wiedmann reported the timeline for the balcony repair at Hose 3 is scheduled for November and H2M is preparing a feasibility questionnaire for the new firehouse.

Chiefs sent letter to the Board requesting to host Department Inspection and Breakfast on Memorial Day, May 31, 2021, at Headquarters and to have Department photo taken. Board approved all items.

Request from the Awards Committee to approve 911 ribbons and

pins. Board approved and requested to see the list before the awards are issued.

Commissioner Quackenbush reported he has gotten pricing for some work he would like to do at the Rose Boulevard Firehouse. He received a quote of \$8,000 from Terra Firma to restore the Terrazzo flooring in parts of the firehouse. Board approved.

Commissioner Quackenbush will get a quote to have the interior of the firehouse painted and has purchased new recliners along with chairs for other firehouses which got us a discount. He expects the total cost of the all the upgrade to be approximately \$25,000.

May 3, 2021

Baldwin Unit 208 removed from service and sold on Auctions International, later sold to the Village of Rockville Centre.

May 4, 2021

Administrator Harron reported the District received a check in the amount of \$26,000 from the Town to cover COVID 19 expenses.

Chief Hughes reported plans to conduct the new SCOTT SCBA training at Fireman’s Field on May 19, 2021, and place them in service by the end of June.

May 12, 2021

Ex-Chief Streithorst reported the District and SCBA committee have been working to get the new SCBA’s ready for distribution. New manuals, website, PowerPoint presentations and a course are being prepared for future training. He stated that all Class 1 and 2 firefighters must don and doff the SCBA and mask, go through the predesigned course before they will be a qualified SCBA user. Chief Hughes thanked Chief Streithorst, the committee and the District for their work and reminded all they must practice with the new packs before going through the training facility.

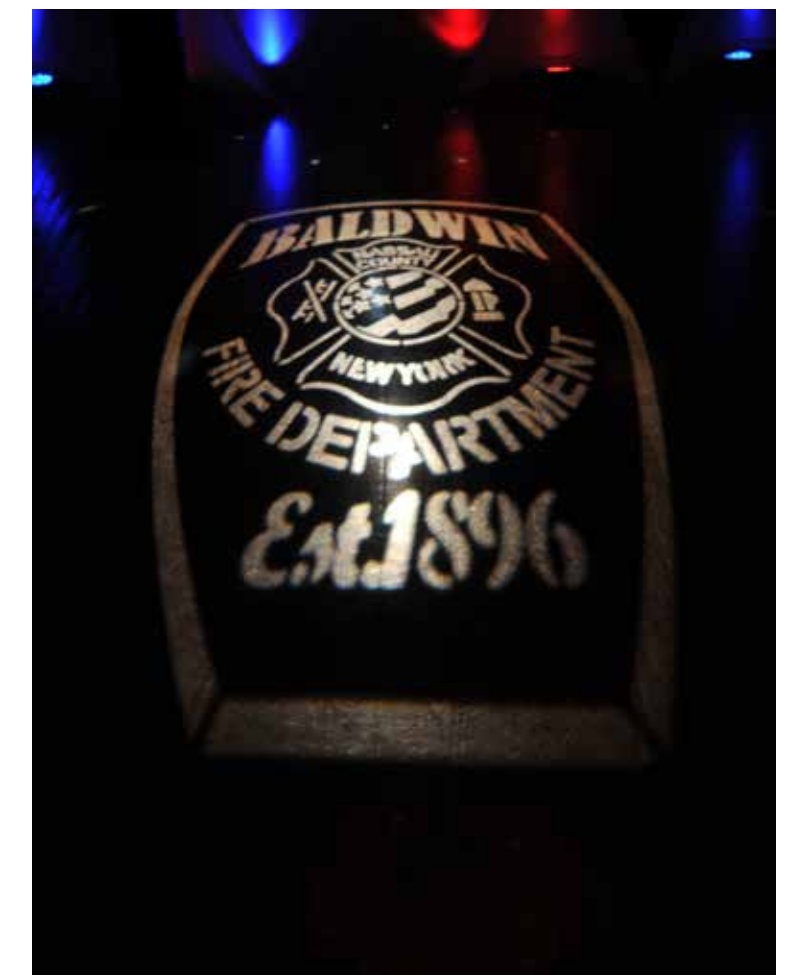

SEPTEMBER 11, 2001

ON THE MORNING OF SEPTEMBER 11, 2001, 19 AL-QAEDA TERRORISTS HIJACKED FOUR COMMERCIAL PASSENGER JET AIRLINERS, INTENTIONALLY CRASHING TWO INTO THE WORLD TRADE CENTER IN NEW YORK CITY. THE HIJACKERS CRASHED A THIRD AIRLINER INTO THE PENTAGON. A FOURTH PLANE CRASHED IN A FIELD NEAR SHANKSVILLE, PENNSYLVANIA AFTER PASSENGERS REALIZED WHAT WAS HAPPENING AND ATTEMPTED TO TAKE CONTROL OF THE AIRCRAFT. NEARLY 3,000 VICTIMS AND THE 19 HIJACKERS DIED IN THE ATTACKS. HUNDREDS MORE HAVE DIED FROM 9/11 INJURIES IN THE YEARS SINCE.

The morning of Sept 11, 2001 was your average morning, sun was shining, sky was blue and the weather was perfect ... who would have thought that at 8:45am things would take a traumatic change.

Cell phones started to ring and all attention given to the closest television for a report of a small plane striking the south tower of the World Trade Center. Live video minutes after the initial reports showed the silhouette of a much larger plane and a tremendous fire on the upper floors of the building. Fears turned to disbelief when at 9:03am a second commercial aircraft struck the north tower and confirmed our worst fears that this was not an accident, but a terrorist attack.

Chief of Department, Chris Neville, monitoring local media immediately responded to Baldwin Headquarters and met with available Department officers and District personnel to evaluate conditions and to assist in activating the Second Battalion Emergency Operations Center (EOC).

The south tower collapsed at 10:05am, killing and trapping hundreds and possibly thousands of civilians and emergency responders from all boroughs of the City of New York. The north tower collapsed at 10:29am.

"I would like to say once again, thank you for your efforts and professionalism shown thus far during this disaster.

I know that there is not a person in this room, who was not touched in some way by this attack. Our thoughts and prayers are not only with those gone or unaccounted for, but also with those who still toil, searching through the rubble for the victims of this terrible assault on our nation.

This would appear to be a long and difficult operation, and I know that the men and women of this department stand ready to assist those in need. However, I again ask, as I did on Thursday evening, that we stand ready until such time that we are requested through proper channels.

Thank you again, and may God Bless us, and watch over our nation in the difficult days ahead."

Although most available members were already at their firehouses by 10:45am, Chief Neville alerted the Department to standby in quarters in anticipation of New York City officials requesting assistance.

Baldwin received its first request (of many) at 11:46am from FDNY Special Operations Command (SOC) for 1 rescue rig and 2 passenger buses. Unit 208, with manpower from Truck Co. 1 and the First Aid Co, were to respond to Roosevelt Island (SOC HQ) and picked up a Lieutenant from the FDNY and respond directly down to “Ground Zero”. The crew consisted of Ex-Captain Joe Brown (chauffeur), Ex-

Chief John Brown (officer) and Ex-Chief Eckels, Ex-Chief Esposito and Stuart Lang as a medic. Buses 209-4 and 209-5 responded to E-270 in Queens to assist with transporting FDNY members who were recalled to work down to “Ground Zero”.

An additional request from the FDNY came at 12:49pm for an engine and ladder to report to a staging area at Belmont Park - units 203 and 207, along with Chief Neville were assigned and responded.

With Chief Neville’s response to New York City, 1st Deputy

Chief Kevin McElynn took over command in Baldwin. 2nd Deputy Chief Kevin Canham and 3rd Deputy Chief Thomas Brown, both members of the FDNY, were recalled after the second tower was hit. With no way to know the duration of events that would unfold, Captains Achong (H-1) and Peletier (T-1), along with Ex-Chief Joseph Yanantuono (H-1) were made acting chiefs in town.

Rescue 208 and its crew spent countless hours searching buildings for survivors and assisting the FDNY with tools and equipment needed to perform those tasks. At 19:58pm, Chief McElynn responded to Belmont staging to relieve Chief

Neville, who along with a partial crew from 207, were to relieve Truck Co. One member down at Ground Zero. 203 and 207 returned to Baldwin at 21:40pm and Ambulance 2010-A was sent at 22:50pm to meet up with Chief McElynn at Belmont staging. They would remain at staging until being released at 1:29am on September 12.

HURRICANE Sandy



OCTOBER 29, 2012

HURRICANE SANDY, THE EIGHTEENTH NAMED STORM AND TWELFTH HURRICANE OF THE 2012 ATLANTIC HURRICANE SEASON, TOUCHED DOWN IN OUR AREA BETWEEN OCTOBER 28TH AND OCTOBER 30TH. AMONG THE MANY CARIBBEAN NATIONS, 24 STATES IN THE US, FROM FLORIDA TO MAINE AND AS FAR WEST AS MICHIGAN & WISCONSIN WERE AFFECTED, WITH PARTICULAR DAMAGE TO NEW JERSEY AND NEW YORK. THE HIGHEST WINDS FROM THIS STORM WERE MEASURED AT 110 MPH. IN TOTAL, 285 FATALITIES WERE REPORTED IN THE US.

Countywide conference calls related to the storm began on Thursday, October 25 and continued daily with local officials until Sunday, when Nassau County OEM became fully operational on a 24 hour basis. STATE OF EMERGENCY declarations were all called pre-landfall, NYS Governor Cuomo on 10/26, NC Executive Ed Mangano on 10/27, TOH Supervisor Kate Murray on 10/28 along with President Barack Obama, who issued a Federal Emergency. By 10/30, Obama issued a Major Disaster Declaration (DR-4085).

Evacuation of storm surge zones was advised to all residents on a voluntary basis by County Executive Mangano beginning Sunday morning, 10/28. By late morning, a mandatory evacuation was ordered for all residents by 2PM. The storm surge zone was indicated as any area south of Merrick Road, from the Suffolk County border to RVC and from Sunrise Highway south - from RVC to the Queens border. Residents were notified that once this order was given,

it may not be possible for first responders to get to them in case of an emergency.

Governor Cuomo ordered the MTA to shut down service to NYC subways, buses, Metro North and LIRR effective 7PM on Sunday 10/28. By 7PM on 10/29, all bridges and tunnels were shut down, effectively isolating Long Island from the mainland.

Prior to Sandy hitting ground, Chief Schwenker asked that each company prepare to be self-sufficient for 72 hours, as no one was sure what the storm would bring. Cots and blankets were inventoried. Companies purchased food for the duration in addition to the EOC securing 200 MRE's for emergency use through the County. Lenox school was approved and available for all members and their families if there was a need to evacuate.

Much of Baldwin lost power due to downed trees and power lines, until ultimately all power south of the Southern State Parkway was shut off by LIPA at approximately 5AM on Tuesday, October 30th. This made navigating through the streets extremely dangerous with downed trees, limbs and wires. Additionally, all traffic signals were out. Nassau County PD eventually closed off travel across Sunrise Highway (north/south traffic) which was not restored until Friday, November 2nd. By Saturday, traffic lights at Sunrise/Central & Sunrise/Milburn were restored - the last of which (Sunrise/Rockwood) was not restored until the following week.

During the height of the storm, water levels rose much higher than ever before. All major intersections south of Sunrise Highway became impassable due to flooding - so much so that Harrison Avenue became the only means in or out of the harbor for a good portion of the night. Flooding (never before seen) occurred in the rear parking lot of Baldwin HQ, flooding the cars of volunteers and not allowing for the staging of incoming units behind the building, rather on both sides of Grand Avenue were utilized.

With permission of Sanitary District No 2, a high-axle rack truck was used to get through rising flood waters in Baldwin harbor. The waters had risen quickly and eventually rendered the first vehicle useless - at which time a second was used. Through Nassau County OEM, a military style high-axle vehicle was delivered (with



a driver from the National Guard) to assist in our rescue attempts, the first of which was to transport members and equipment to a house fire on Grand Avenue, inaccessible with fire apparatus due to chest high water. This vehicle ultimately made its way to Island Park to assist with their efforts.

Both SWRT boats, along with 209-B's personal boat, provided for three teams deployed at various locations tasked with performing rescue maneuvers in the rising flood waters.

As the storm progressed into a multi-day operation, outside units from FEMA (engines/trucks/ambulances) were brought in to supplement and give relief to our members. Headquarters hall (and subsequently Hose 3) became housing for these units, along with line workers needing to rest, with relatively no distraction to the day to day operations of the District and Department.

There were a total of 386 alarms recorded that were attributed to Hurricane Sandy during the 2 week period from 10/28 to 11/10, including 4 working fires. There are many more that were unable to be recorded.

COVID-19 Pandemic

MARCH 2020

THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC, ALSO KNOWN AS THE CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC, IS AN ONGOING GLOBAL PANDEMIC OF CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19) CAUSED BY SEVERE ACUTE RESPIRATORY SYNDROME CORONAVIRUS 2 (SARS-COV-2). THE NOVEL VIRUS WAS FIRST IDENTIFIED FROM AN OUTBREAK IN THE CHINESE CITY OF WUHAN IN DECEMBER 2019, AND ATTEMPTS TO CONTAIN IT THERE FAILED, ALLOWING IT TO SPREAD ACROSS THE GLOBE. THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION (WHO) DECLARED A PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY OF INTERNATIONAL CONCERN ON 30 JANUARY 2020 AND A PANDEMIC ON 11 MARCH 2020. AS OF 14 JANUARY 2022, THE PANDEMIC HAD CAUSED MORE THAN 321 MILLION CASES AND 5.52 MILLION DEATHS, MAKING IT ONE OF THE DEADLIEST IN HISTORY.

AS OF THIS PRINTING, THE PANDEMIC IS STILL ONGOING.

The year 2020 started off the same as any other year in the Baldwin Fire Department. Accolades to the companies for a great job in the previous year, thanks to the outgoing captains for all of their hard work and good luck to the new officers. Then turned to planning the activities for the upcoming year, but none of us could have foreseen how the year would go. As winter turned to spring and as St. Patrick's Day was approaching, the world was beginning to shut down.

New York was put on a pause due to the Corona virus. Everyone except essential workers were required to stay home. There was a run on paper towels, cleaning supplies and toilet paper. Everyone started working from home and schools were closed. Buses and trains ran empty and airports were shut down.

On March 16 2020 at a special meeting of the Board and the Chiefs, unprecedented decisions were being made. The Annual Department Dinner scheduled for early April would be canceled. Firehouses would be closed to everything except for alarms. There would be no meetings, no training, and no social events.

This was the first of many meetings with the Board to discuss how to navigate this new way to operate. Countless new policies affecting dispatching, response and operations along with how to handle when our members were exposed or tested positive for Covid needed to be developed. There were also weekly briefings every Saturday on Zoom from the Nassau County Office of Emergency Management (OEM) and Daily Fire Service Situational Awareness Reports.

Along with the run-on consumer goods, getting basic PPE to protect our members was becoming impossible. Supplies we had in stock to last a year would now only last 2 weeks, as every EMS call required members to don full PPE, gowns, gloves, N95 mask and goggles. District Supervisor Ed Moore coordinated weekly emergency supply deliveries with Nassau County OEM and also searched for vendors that may have something left.

Even though the firehouses were closed, every day the district personnel, who were working split shifts to keep them safe, cleaned and disinfected every firehouse and every apparatus. The cleaning of the EMS gear also become a daily necessity as

the gear required cleaning after every call.

Information on the virus was changing daily and so EMS protocols were also changing daily. For a while it was actually policy that CPR should not be started unless the arrest was witnessed or not transporting unless CPR was successful. Hospitals were becoming overrun with patients and our EMS crews were waiting hours at the hospital because there was no place to transfer the patients.

Until June, Nassau County required daily EMS duty crews, a list of members who would definitely respond to alarms, emailed to them every morning. First Aid Captain Linda Nolan coordinated this every day for 2 ½ months.

From March until June there were no in-person meetings, now we had Zoom company meetings, no drills or training and maintenance was performed by only one member at a time. At alarms only the minimum number of members, each wearing face coverings were used and only after the residents were interviewed from a distance as to the health conditions of the people inside, did anyone enter a premises. It was quite a change from our normal operations.

Even with all of our precautions in place, unfortunately some members still contracted the virus. To limit the spread, members that were in contact with affected members were also required to quarantine for ten to fourteen days. This put a strain on our available manpower and we even had an entire



company out of service for a week.

In June we began to reopen, Backrooms were opened to members only, no guests. Company meetings were held on the apparatus floors or outside where we could socially distance. Sunday Breakfast returned to Hose Three, but now served out on the deck and when it got too cold in the fall, on the apparatus floor.

Throughout the year normal activities like the parades and the department picnic were being canceled. Others, like the Department meeting and elections were severely altered to have all members vote by absentee ballot and the meeting was broadcasted over zoom with only the captains attending in person.

As the year came to a close there was both good and bad news. The vaccine for Covid-19 was now available for first responders. Lt. Lonnie Green was tasked with the tremendous job of coordinating vaccine appointments so everyone in the department could be vaccinated.



This time also saw a spike in the transmission, so for second time it was decided to close the firehouses from mid-January until March of 2021 to allow everyone time to be fully vaccinated.

The year 2020 was truly unprecedented in the way it continued to test us daily. All of the members of the department preformed with the utmost professionalism and dedication throughout the year. Going out every single day and night to help the residents of Baldwin on some of the worst days of their lives, we did it not for a paycheck, but for the love of our neighbors, our community, and the love of the job we do.

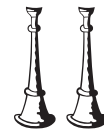

THROUGHOUT THE HISTORY OF THE BALDWIN FIRE DEPARTMENT, EACH COMPANY HAD THEIR OWN RACING TEAM THAT PARTICIPATED IN EVENTS THROUGHOUT LONG ISLAND AND NEW YORK STATE. MOST OF THE TEAMS HAD DISBANDED OVER THE YEARS. ON THE EVE OF OUR 100TH ANNIVERSARY, VARIOUS MEMBERS OF THE BALDWIN FIRE DEPARTMENT CAME TOGETHER TO CREATE A DEPARTMENT-WIDE RACING TEAM ... FORMING WHAT IS NOW KNOWN AS THE BALDWIN TOMCATS RACING TEAM.

During the team's first summer season, it had the pleasure to host the New York State Old-Fashioned tournament at Firemen's field in conjunction with the 100th Anniversary parade. The Tomcats placed fifth overall.

For the first season, the Tomcats raced strictly old-fashioned events. However, the charter membership pooled enough money between them and purchased a B-truck from the East Meadow Fire Department for a grand total of one hundred dollars. The truck was hidden at the homes of several members until the District would allow the truck to be used on the track.

The B-truck's first track race was in 1997 at the New York State Tournament held in Hempstead.

Although the team didn't place in any event, we were excited to finally have a truck to run in a tournament. The was in use until 2014, when a new B-truck was purchased from the Lakeview fire department. This truck is currently in use today.

In 2000, the team decided it was time to expand and purchase a C-truck. The team reached out and found that Oyster Bay was selling their truck. The Tomcats agreed to buy it and put it to use.

All three trucks have had a lot of modifications and upgrades over the years, thanks to many friends of the team and members of the Department.

In 2016, the Tomcats had a great day and won first place at an Old-Fashioned tournament in Bayville.

In 2021, the Baldwin Fire Department celebrated one hundred and twenty-five years of service and once again the Tomcats held the New York State Old-Fashioned tournament. The team placed second overall.

The Tomcats have and continue to do their best at every tournament that they attend. Even when manpower was sparse, the team always attended local tournaments and participated in whatever events they could. The Tomcats membership always gives 110%.

Since its inception there have been nearly 100 department members on the team, many of those members have been moved on to be line officers and Chiefs. A special thanks to all the members who have ever run with the Baldwin Tomcats.

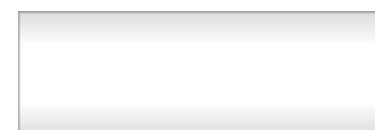

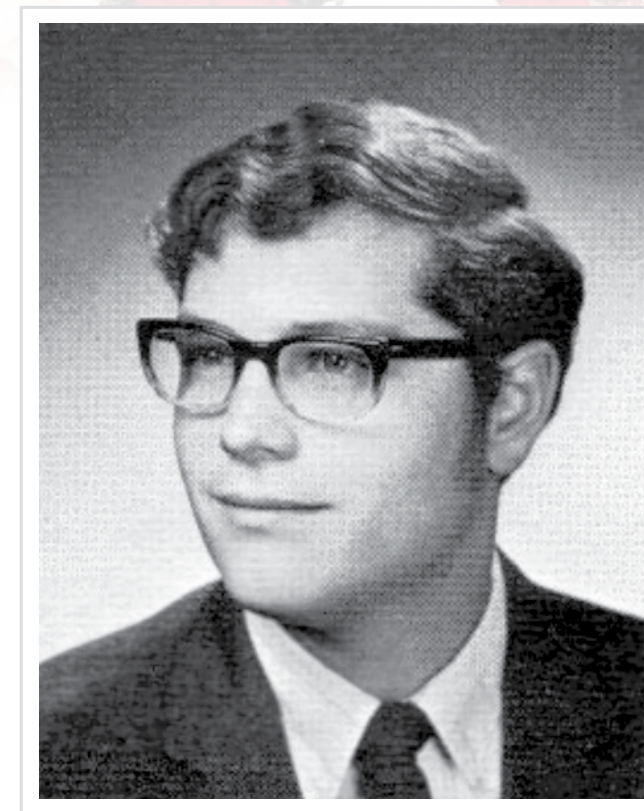

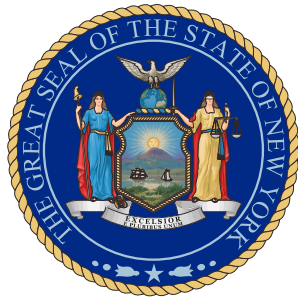
Douglas has been a member of the Baldwin Fire Department for 27 years.

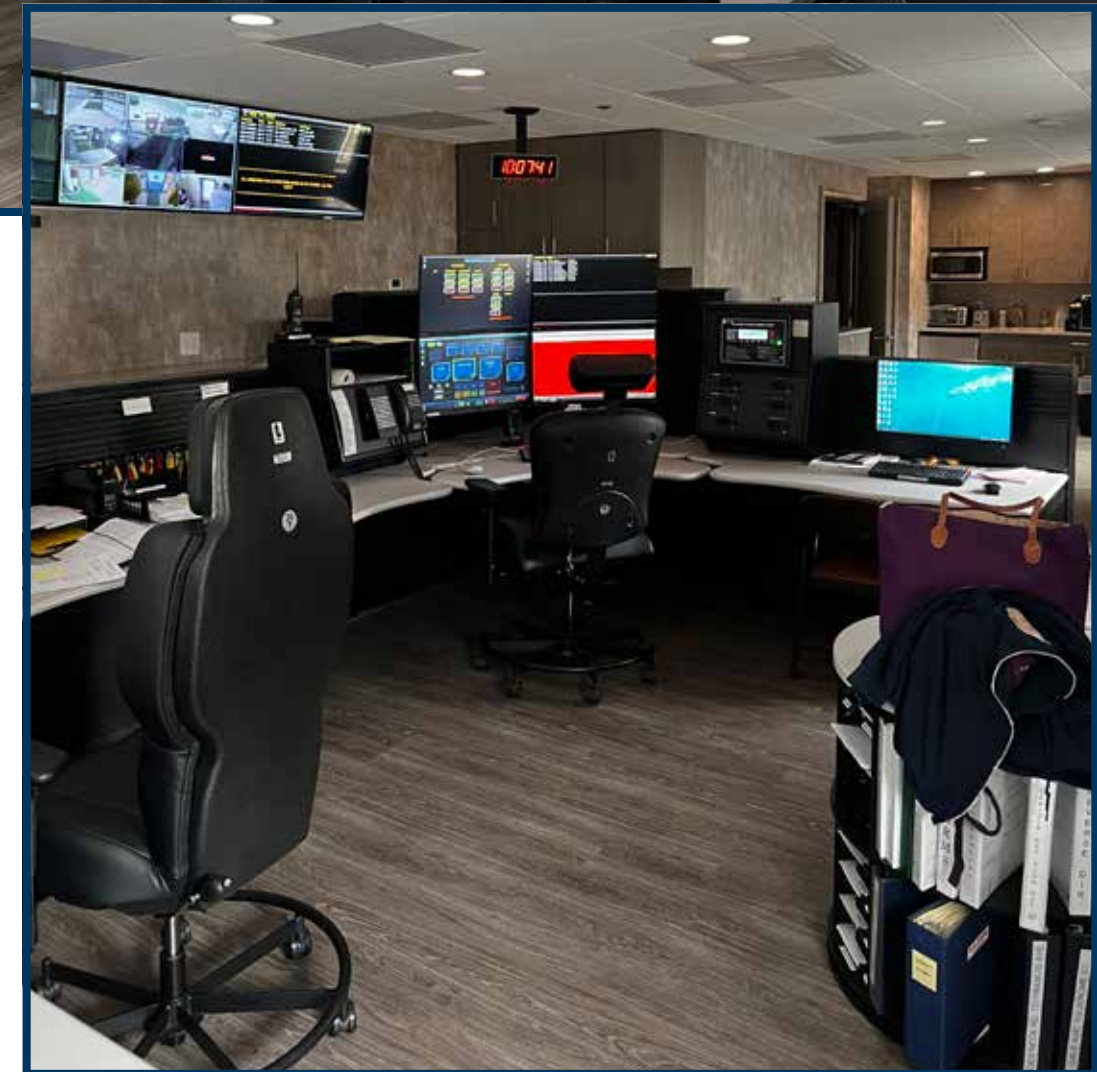
